

Dr. Boone has worked tirelessly in the matters of racial healing and as a statesman of prayer, serving on numerous national and regional boards. She has spoken in many venues across the United States and other nations. Her emphasis on prayer, unity, racial reconciliation and bridging the gap between generations earns her a unique position in the nation and world at large. She is God's ambassador of prayer and reconciliation.

The prayer generals include Toby Holmes, Stephen Underwood, <u>Pastor Jeff Wright</u>, Dexter and Angela Colburn, Pastor Michael Obi, Dr. Andre Randall, Sheryl Harris, Jason Hershey and many others, along with my spiritual sons and daughters who stand and serve these moments of Kingdomstrategy faithfully. What a joy! I remember so many prayer meetings where we stood in the gap together, building up our community, city, nation and world.

These leaders represent an army of faithful intercessors who are persistent in prayer—a unified army that are here on this National Day of Prayer to do battle against the forces of darkness.

Thanks again for all the help you've given us through the past 25 years with the D.C. Prayer Tours you've allowed us to organize from your annual D.C. Victory Campaign. We held our 26th annual D.C. Prayer Tour on Sunday, November 14, at 9 A.M. until 11 A.M., on the morning after your recent D.C. Victory Campaign ended!

The reservations this year totaled 6, of which all 6 attended (see group photo below). Per Covid pandemic restrictions the Hylton Chapel did not allow us to set up a reservation table in the hallway outside your main meeting room as in every past year. All of your other usual vendor tables were likewise missing including your product sales tables.

See the enclosed copy of an announcement I gave to one of your staff workers in the main front lobby on Sat. Nov. 13 at about 9:25 A.M. for them to give to you—it asked people to call our 800 phone number to make bus reservations. You may remember this is how we took reservations the first year you held a D.C. Victory Campaign back in 1994. As far as I could tell, that announcement was never made over the sound system from your platform this year.

Despite the lack of an announcement, but because of the past 25 years we have offered the D.C. Prayer Tour annually from your D.C. Victory Campaign, the four people besides myself shown in the photo below recognized me in the hallways between your meetings, and made verbal reservations.

The Quality Tours 56-passenger bus we used this year was on-time, in excellent condition, with a friendly, capable driver. The temperature was close to freezing, but the sky was mostly clear. We included in the tour a group prayer for God to strengthen Kenneth and Gloria and all of you from KCM as a special multiplied return for giving us the glorious D.C. Victory Campaign again this year!

Our bus rental charge for Nov. 14 was \$604. The offering we collected that day on the bus totaled \$220. Enclosed is \$100 as a tithe and offering for KCM—praise God! God has always made up the difference! Also enclosed are some of the Nov. 14 participant response forms.

It's been on my heart for some years to ask you to pray about having me on the daily TV broadcast with Kenneth and yourself to promote the creation of prayer tours in every city across America and the world. More than ever the body of Christ needs this practical proven discipline to be doers of 1st Tim. 2:1-4 and first of all make intensive, extensive interaction with God for fervent, effectual, strategic, anointed supplications (specific urgent requests), prayers (more general year-round requests), intercessions by the Spirit of God to block hell and bridge for heaven, and giving of thanks, like Kenneth Hagin Sr. used to say, in effect, "Pray till you sing, that's when you know you have the victory." One prayer teacher used to recommend a weekly Saturday morning prayer tour of abortion clinics in cities to add variety, intensity and focus in conjunction with daily early morning prayer and lengthy Friday night prayer meetings at the church building.

We look forward to working with you at your future meetings in D.C. and elsewhere as the Lord directs!






(TOP) ROBERTA (BOBI) HROMAS was featured on the front cover of Christianity Today magazine in Oct. 1987. In 1982 she founded the American Christian Trust as a bed and breakfast prayer house in D.C., the year before Jeff Wright moved to D.C. and began weekly Sunday morning D.C. prayer tours, many times for groups staying at the American Christian Trust. Bobi Hromas passed from this world to heaven on Aug. 3, 2021; Jeff Wright attended a memorial service for her at the American Christian Trust on Oct. 17, 2021. Part of Mrs. Hromas' vision was to recruit local pastors to bring their prayer warriors to help maintain 24/7 prayer in the prayer room of the American Christian Trust which is located on the west side of the Israeli Embassy. Jeff joined that effort by bringing a prayer team on the 1st Friday of each month from 1984-1988 to pray from midnight until 6 A.M. (BOTTOM) OCT. 3: In recent years Jeff was recruited by a D.C. area long-time messianic rabbi to establish a 1st Saturday 6 A.M. – 7 A.M. prayer altar at the American Christian Trust in conjunction with the Jericho Prayer Movement, which coordinates similar prayer altars at 10 strategic D.C. locations plus others across America and the world. (TOP) LEFT: MARK PRITCHETT has been serving as the administrator for the American Christian Trust for many years. His mother belonged to the Bible Study that met in Bobi Hromas' home for years and from which the money was raised to buy the American Christian Trust in D.C. in 1982 on the west side of the Israeli Embassy. Mark also currently serves as the resident manager/cook/cleaner/laundry service and all-around servant leader at the Trust. (MIDDLE) In 1983 Jeff Wright donated his Prayer Handbook and Motivation to Pray for Nations, Leaders & World Events to the prayer room of the American Christian Trust, which has kept those resources on display there for almost 40 years to help intercessors pray God's Word for nations, leaders and world events. (BOTTOM) Recently the prayer room was repainted and redecorated, including this new drape for the back of the piano: Let All Nations Praise The Lord!



JULIUS GORDON (FAR LEFT) left this world for heaven on Oct. 15, 2021 at the age of 77. Julius grew up in Washington, D.C. and was a veteran of the US Navy during the Vietnam war. He was a long-time employee of the telephone company Verizon, and was a pioneer in racial integration of that workplace after his military service. Julius had a Jewish grandfather, a Baptist grandmother, and a Muslim father. In the Navy Julius's dogtag said "Muslim." He also studied Transcendental Meditation for several years. Eventually a co-worker at the phone company got him to start watching TV preacher Fred Price from Crenshaw Christian Center in Los Angeles, CA. From there Julius saw a TV ad for a local DC area church that taught the same principles of faith for healing and prosperity that Fred Price taught. Thus in 1986 Julius joined Victory World Outreach Church (the host church for the National Prayer Embassy) and became active in the choir, home groups, men's ministry, homeless shelter ministry and street ministry. Julius served as a board member for the past 20 years and a frequent participant in our Prayer Tours. In 1998 - 2000 Julius and his wife Joan led a bi-weekly DC prayer tour and filled in for Jeff Wright in leading the annual DC Prayer Tour in conjunction with Kenneth Copeland Ministries DC Victory Campaign. Julius and Joan also attended several of the Hollywood Prayer Tours conducted by Jeff Wright and the National Prayer Embassy from 1996 - 2009 in conjunction with Kenneth Copeland Ministries West Coast Believers Conventions, and did many prayer tours of state capitols on their way to and from California. From 2010 - 2020 Julius helped host the weekly Sunday morning church service for Victory World Outreach Church in the home he shared with his wife Joan. For about ten years from about 2001 -2011 Julius and Joan led the prayer room at the annual Weekends to Remember Family Life Marriage Conferences in the Washington, DC area. Julius and Joan had a remarkable prayer life together as a married couple, spending an hour together in prayer first thing every morning for decades. Well done good and faithful servant of our Lord Jesus Christ!
